## Dear Colleague:

The *HEDIS MY 2025 Volume 2: Technical Update* is a full-text publication that includes direct edits in red text, in lieu of a table format referencing phrasing and edit location, and displays the exact placement of updates. Changes in this re-released publication are required for HEDIS MY 2025 reporting. With this release, NCQA freezes the Volume 2 technical specifications for MY 2025.

- Obtaining the updated HEDIS MY 2025 Volume 2. The re-released publication is available for download by customers with access to the HEDIS MY 2025 Volume 2 e-pub. Go to the My Downloads section of My NCQA and download the MY 2025 Volume 2 (epub) zipped folder, which will contain the updated MY 2025 Volume 2 file.
- Obtaining the Medication List Directory (MLD), Risk Adjustment Tables and updated Value Set Directory (VSD). The final versions of the MLD, VSD and Risk Adjustment Tables for MY 2025 reporting are included in the zipped folder that contains the MY 2025 Volume 2 e-pub. Customers who do not have access to the Volume 2 e-pub may order the MLD and Risk Adjustment Tables for free from the NCQA Store.
- Obtaining the Random Number (RAND) Table. Starting with MY 2025 reporting, the RAND table will be released on October 15, and will be available in the NCQA Store for purchasers of the HEDIS MY Volume 2 e-pub. To obtain the RAND table for MY 2025 reporting, on or after October 15, go to the My Downloads section of My NCQA and download the MY 2025 Volume 2 (epub) zipped folder, which will contain the RAND table.
- **Measurement Year 2026.** NCQA is releasing specifications in a new format starting in MY 2026. Purchasers of HEDIS MY 2025 Volume 2 can download examples of measures in this new format in the My Downloads section of My NCQA. These examples are for informational purposes only, and the measures included may not be used for reporting.

The HEDIS Audit Timeline for MY 2025 is available on the NCQA website.
